Because of the method of recording different sections at different times and then melding them together, we are able to follow the Anglican Diocese of Ottawa guidelines on Physical Distancing. There are no more than three of us in the church at any one time and we maintain a distance of 2m between us.

ADOn the Move

Masks in Indoor Public Spaces

Although the Anglican churches are not open for public worship, it is interesting to note what some of the public health regulations for churches look like, in particular, with Ottawa Public Health making face masks mandatory in all indoor public spaces - a change which went into effect on July 7. The office has received a number of emails from Keith Egli as Ottawa Public Health developed the guidelines for worship spaces. The end result was the following guideline:

The officiant of a religious ceremony can choose to not wear a mask if standing in an area of the religious space that is separate from the public attending the ceremony. The officiant should use a microphone to project their voice to reduce the risk of respiratory droplets being spread; and not

engage in any singing or chanting. The officiant should stand at least 5 metres from the people attending and if there is more than one officiant, they should be spaced at least 2 metres apart from each other and not be facing each other.

There was further clarification from Keith Egli's office:

Further to the email shared this morning we have received a number of questions about singing. The intent of the exemption is with regard to preaching or speaking not singing. I have verified with OPH and unfortunately singing carries more risk of virus transmission and therefore the existing guidelines/restrictions with regard to singing remain in place.

Fabric Face Masks

Face masks are now required in Ottawa at all indoor public spaces.

If anyone would like a fabric mask, there are sewers at St Mark's who can make you one. Just let the office know. It has been taking a while to fill the orders so don't give up if you have ordered.

Sharing Coffee Hour

If you would like to share a photo, a recipe of what you would have made for coffee hour and/or a short hello message with a few details of what you've been up to, then you are welcome to do so. The editor will not seek out people but would be happy to receive submissions.

This summer, Joy and her mom have been eating lots of salads for lunch. This is a new and tasty discovery:

Black Bean Salad

- 3 cans black beans or 4 ½ cups cooked black beans, rinsed and well-drained*
- 2 ears of corn, shucked, or 1 cup defrosted frozen corn

- orange, yellow or red bell pepper, chopped
- 1 c quartered cherry tomatoes
- chopped sweet onion
- ½ c finely chopped fresh cilantro (about ½ medium bunch)
- 1 medium jalapeño, finely chopped (keep the seeds for heat if you'd like, or remove them for mild flavor)
- ½ t lime zest (from 1 lime)
- 2 T lime juice (about 1 lime), to taste
- ¹/₄ c extra-virgin olive oil
- ¹/₄ c white wine vinegar
- ½ t chili powder
- ½ t ground cumin
 Optional garnishes: sliced avocado,
 crumbled feta, lime wedges

In a large serving bowl, combine all of the ingredients and toss to combine. Taste, and adjust as necessary until the flavors really pop—I usually add another teaspoon or two of vinegar (you can use lime juice instead, for more mild flavor) and another ½ teaspoon salt. (I usually combine from lime zest to cumin together as a dressing and then pour it on.)

Cover and chill to enhance the flavors—preferably for at least 2 hours, or overnight. Serve in individual bowls as is, or with any of the garnishes listed. Leftovers keep well for up to 4 days or so.

* I cook my black beans in the instant pot. Use 2 c of dried beans and 4 c of water and cook for 30 minutes. Release the pressure naturally (up to 20 minutes or so.)
