1. Opening the meeting

Call to order: Pauline Adams opened the meeting. She noted this was a Budget meeting and that other reports would be accepted as distributed, unless specific information needed to be addressed.

3. Business arising from previous meeting

4. Regular Reports

a. Rector's Report

Bishop Peter noted the Parish was doing very well, and that a date for Vestry would be needed. **Vestry** - February 24, 2019 is the tentative date.

b. Treasurer's Report - Georgia Roberts

Georgia projected the 2018 finances should be close to expected. (see Appendix A)

- Collections in-line with projected budget.
- Fundraising up and rental/user fees up.
- Net income above what was budgeted
- Total General income possibly above budget.
- Total programs possibly under budget
- Church on budget apart from extra needed for painting and paving from reserves.
- Finance on budget
- Miscellaneous on budget
- Expect to be in the black by December 31, 2018

Budget 2019 (see Appendix A)

Georgia presented the proposed Budget for 2019.

Income:

- Most figures have been taken from the 2018 budget
- Assets reduced due to funds used from dividends / reserves
- Solar \$10,000 might be high, with recent reduced income the past few years
- User fees assuming we retain the present renters/users
- Reserves will be needed for the chimney capping held over from 2018

Expenses:

- Staff this might change a bit
- Clergy fill-in for 6 Sundays
- Fare share this is up, as we'd had reduced rate in the past due to furnace purchase etc
- Programs a few changes and two new items (see Appendix B)
 - AED There was concern raised in asking volunteers to pay for training
 - Coffee, Company and Conversation (CCC) for Seniors there is a new budget line for this program, of \$900 (\$30 per 30 sessions for the year).
 - o Suggested that committee ask parish to help provide refreshments etc
 - Noted that Sept to Nov 2018 costs were \$450.
 - Noted that \$500 in Seniors Reserve not included as part of the budget request.
 - o Questions re breakdown of budget advertising costs / program costs
 - Budget Funds could include a possible program coordinator
 - Suggestion that with this being a new program details of 2018 costs be sent to Parish Council for budget discussion in January 2, 2019
 - Request for Outreach 2018 balance of \$279 go towards CCC costs for 2018 be part of that discussion.
- Music \$150 has been too low in the past. Ariane Dind to be asked as to real budget need.
- Stewardship prayerful consideration be key to giving, a theological necessity to give. Next Stewardship Campaign is 2020, but a mini stewardship might be considered to giving extra
- Regular Building Upgrade (see Appendix B)
 - It was suggested to form a committee to handle these projects.
 - Facia on back roof has been added to list.
 - There are possible grant funds available for some projects eg Anglican Foundation etc for bathroom accessibility (planning and application well in advance) Rectory fund also might be used for internal building changes.

c. Wardens' Report - Pauline Adams and Cynthia Greer

Corporation

Last week's Corporation meeting was spent discussing the proposed budget.

Emergency Card: One idea brought up last month was to get those who were comfortable with the idea to give us their emergency contact information.

There have been commercials on the radio for anyone 50 or over to get a free plastic emergency contact card.

This is the web-site, freeemergencycontactcard.ca, although when I went on there were numerous sites.

One of us will get one, to see it and decide if that is a good idea.

Check it out and see what you think.

We would need paper copies of the information on a list rather than just in the computer.

d. Property Report - Cynthia Greer

Signs: We still need someone to put up the handicapped signs, and the signs on the magnetic sign board, out front, advertising our Christmas services. Georgia and Russ put up the ones which are actually visible, on the white board. Thank you.

This is an item which needs action, although we haven't found anything reasonably priced. The present one is badly placed, the wrong colour for visibility, and the letters are too small and close together. How do we get light on it?

e. Membership / Vitality / Communications Report - Margaret Lodge

Christmas Puddings and Calendars: St Mark's Mothers' Union, with support from the parish, will be making their third batch of puddings. They continue to sell 2018 Anglican Church calendars.

Vitality Group:

Members of the Vitality group for 2018 were Cynthia Greer, Penny Miller, Kate Greer-Close, Maria Padin, Suzanne Bisson and Margaret Lodge. There were 5 events for 2018:

- Card Party on March 7 the newly-resurrected-and-now-annual event run by Carol Russell and Pat Sinclair, assisted by Mothers' Union in the kitchen;
- St Mark's Patronal lunch on April 22, supporting Cornerstone;
- Big Give/Doors Open Ottawa June 2/3;
- St Mark's Parish dinner on October 20, concert by the Valley Men; and
- Stairwell Carollers concert December 7.

This time last year, Vitality wanted to close the FUNDraising aspect of the group, but agreed to let \$2000 stand in the 2018 budget. Thanks to the work of the few and the support of the many in the parish we raised \$3304.63, much more than our goal, and even had funds to donate to the parish support of Cornerstone. Our total profit for parish funds was \$2829.63.

These gatherings are popular and well-attended - up to 38 persons attending with approximately 1/3 of the group from outside of the parish.

Margaret Lodge has designed some new posters and the committee members thank her for her gracious support in our publicity efforts. In the new year, the committee will fan out and blitz the neighbourhood again - this includes community centres, curling club and retirement residences.

This time we plan to personally approach the activities coordinators of retirement residences so that they can co-ordinate the residents who are able to attend.

k. Children and Youth (Sunday School) - Kate Greer-Close

This is a busy season in the Sunday school too with fund-raising activities (thanks to Lodges for the candle donations and to Janis for the donation of her beautiful hand-made cards). We have raised approximately \$130. The children and I will consider options available through several aid organisations such as PWRDF, Plan, World Vision and the Christian Children's Fund of Canada.

We also decorated four full trays of cookies last week (thanks to our bakers - Penny, Joy, Carol and Brenda) for St Luke's Table. We are also colouring Christmas cards (Margaret's designs) to distribute among parishioners and Perley residents (as many as we can colour!)

We have been singing and reviewing the Christmas story too to prepare for our pageant next Sunday (December 23). The Junior choir and guests (usually additional youth from the parish) also lead the music for the early Christmas Eve service.

I am considering a lunch & movie party on January 6.

Footnotes:

- a: Predicted from actual giving patterns over past few years
- **b**: Per diem rate for 6 days from 2019 Stipendary Scales and Allowances. Does not include travel reimbursement.
- **c**: This amount is 2 lay staff salaries plus ECOPS plus clergy housing allowance less earnings from Rectory CTF. Increase of 2.99% over 2018 for our 2 lay staff, in line with clergy salary increases.
- d: \$1000 is guess at price for lowering and capping chimney. For this project, money is budgeted to come from the capital reserve fund. This is holdover from 2018.

Additional information to accompany the 2019 draft budget for December 2018 PC Meeting

New categories in Program expenses:

- 1. Coffee, Company and Conversation, the new seniors outreach initiative, has requested \$900 for 2019. This is for 30 sessions 15 between January and June 2019 and 15 between September and December 2019. The organizing committee is requesting \$30, on average, per session, for program and refreshments. The committee has also requested \$75 for an organizational membership to the Council on Aging of Ottawa. This amount has been included in the "Conferences and Memberships" category.
- 2. Library: Betty Caughlin, our librarian, has requested \$150.
- 3. AED: Until mid-2018, the expenditures for the AED were managed by the Wellness committee. The responsibilities for the AED are now in the hands of Corporation. The amount showing in the draft budget for AED (\$370) is just a repeat from what was shown under Wellness-AED in the 2018 budget and may need adjustment.

Some Possible Repair and Upgrade expenditures in 2019 and beyond

The draft budget currently shows an amount of \$5000 for repair and upgrade expenditures. While there are always definite expenditures required, there are others, shown in the table below, that are being proposed by Cynthia, our current "property person", for consideration in the coming year or wishful thinking down the road. None have been priced out exactly.

In the current draft budget, the special project of lowering and capping the chimney has been repeated since there was no action in 2018. While \$1000 is shown as the amount, this repair has not actually been priced. For this project, money is budgeted to come from the capital reserve fund.
