3. Business arising from previous meeting(s)

i) Budget 2017

Parish Council reviewed and had continued discussion of the proposed 2017 budget.

At the end of the review and discussion Parish Council offered appreciation to the members of the Vitality group for their efforts in fundraising activities.

Parish Council suggested that there be one combined service starting 9:00 am so the 8:00 am parishioners can attend as well. The service change will be taken under consideration by Corporation.

iii) New Ministry

Suzanne Wilkins presented Summary Notes (scan attached) from the St. Mark's Ministry Group Meeting. Fr. Jim commented on the request of the Bishop for St. Mark's to have a ministry focus. Elder care is going to be a huge issue in the province. St. Mark's has the skill set as seen through friendly visitors, the card ministry, Perley volunteers etc. Our history in elder care reaches back to Betty Gillham and her support of seniors and her service to them. There is a great need for programming and we could perhaps become a centre of excellence in the diocese. Margaret Lodge suggested that there be a report prepared for Vestry.

4. Regular Reports

a. Rector's Report

Fr. Jim attended a planning meeting with the Greek Orthodox (Dormition of the Virgin Mary), Antiochan Orthodox (St. Elias), Madonna Della Risurrezione on January 12, 2017. This shared ecumenical service is being celebrated jointly by the neighbourhood chuches at The Dormition of the Virgin Mary Greek Orthodox Church, 1315 Prince of Wales Dr. and will start at 5pm.

b. Warden's Report/ Property

Sharon Walters has withdrawn from the position of Rector's Warden because of personal and professional reasons. There are just over two more years remaining to complete this position as it is an appointed position. Fr Jim has some suggested names and will be approaching these people. On Sunday we found out that the person who had been approached to take over the Treasurer position has declined. The search for a treasurer continues.

Property: Our thanks go to Cynthia and Paul Greer who researched and then replaced the outdoor light at the end of the hall which now offers better lighting coverage of the back parking lot. A donation was received to cover the costs of this. Paul Greer is clearing the snow off of the roof above where we have had leaks inside the church, to see if this makes a difference. Thank you.

e. Stewardship

As we discussed, I am going to talk to Jim regarding a Stewardship Sunday, one in January, potentially one in June and another in Nov/Dec. Each one will have a theme. the January one is giving thanks. We will hopefully link the sermon to and opportunity to give thanks as a congregation. Details need to be worked out but I was thinking about having the 8 & 10 a.m. services write down what they are thankful for and collect them. At vestry I would ask for a few minutes to present a slide show on all the things we are thankful for as a congregation. The other two stewardship Sundays would also have themes and at least one of them would focus on faithful and sacrificial giving.

With respect to fund raising, I would like to suggest that corporation consider establishing a team to take on fundraising in an intentional manner. They would be the coordinators/facilitators and work with groups like Vitality to enhance fundraising. Vitality certainly has the internal St. Mark's portion wrapped up but there may be other opportunities such as rental, special events and other opportunities not funded by the congregation.

As I mentioned when I took on Stewardship it was not supposed to be all about fundraising or money. I would be willing to participate with any group to provide stewardship insights etc. but not in a leadership capacity.

f. Choir

The choirs have worked very hard in preparation for the Advent and Christmas services and in the presentation of the musical parts of the liturgy for the entire Christmas

season. I have not heard from our director of music, but it is my feeling that the commitment and devotion of these St. Mark's volunteers is commendable. I have also heard feedback that the music sung by the choirs was both beautiful and transcending and that the choir rates as one of the best in the Ottawa Anglican diocese.

g. Children and Youth(Sunday School / Junior choir report)

Advent wreaths: we sold 10 wreaths and received donations of materials as well as funds and so were able to raise \$225. The children and I will be deciding where to direct those funds this Sunday (Plan, World Vision likely).

Cookies: thanks to generous bakers and a great turnout of children we decorated cookies and donated them to St Luke's, The Mission and Salvation Army (Booth Centre).

Cards: the children coloured cards for our elderly and shut-in parishioners, and folk who attend our Friday services at the Perley; my mum (Cynthia Greer) mailed/delivered them

Pageant: There were about 20 children at the early Christmas Eve service and 15 of them participated in the pageant (7 children plus 2 young adults (Sarah and Alex Dee) sang in the choir).

Donation: We received a donation of funds directed to the children, with which I have purchased prayer cubes as gifts for the children.

I think that is all for now. I am very thankful for all of the support our congregation offers to our children's programs.

Membership / Vitality Report January 2017

Membership

No new members since January 1, 2017 Presently have 195 family units Newcomers in 2016 were 13 family units Family units that were removed from our parish lists in 2016

6 moved out of parish

3 died

3 removed

Vitality

A group from Vitality signed the Christmas cards for parishioners. The card was of St Mark's Nativity window, produced by Joy Bowerman.

In 2016 the Vitality group was challenged to raise \$5000 to help keep the church financially viable. This was not originally part of our mandate, but this challenge was accepted, and a number of FUN(d)raising events took place, including fun / community outreach / fundraising activities:

- Queen Elizabeth Dinner
- Card party
- Songs4Soul
- Big Give
- Tales &Tunes
- Garage Sale
- Pasta Supper
- Stairwell Carollers

We not only raised the \$5000 challenge but surpassed by over \$3000. At the last Parish Council meeting, we were just under \$7000, short \$19 - council was asked to make up the balance – and they did! In late December the ACW Card Party profit (Jackie Sorfleet and friends) added another \$1000. The final total was \$8023.

This had been a major challenge for Vitality – but we had amazing support from the congregation and friends, and also the greater community through the two non-parish concerts.

We have been commissioned to help raise \$5000 through social activities again for 2017. The group will meet in the next week to plan programs for 2017. Possible suggestions being:

- April 23 weekend St Mark's patronal feast (25th)
- Card Party in May ?
- Garage Sale in May
- Songs 4 the Soul 2 parish choral workshop in May
- Big Give in June
- 2 parish suppers (spring / fall)
- 1 or 2 non-parish entertainment program (fall)

St. Mark's Ministry Group Meeting

Summary Notes

The following possibilities were discussed for the use of the church in and for the community, <u>preferably in partnership</u>:

- 1. Diocesan Community Ministries Satellite a possible counselling site for the Ottawa Pastoral Counselling Center for example.
- Hospice Satellite for bereavement counselling and groups and possibly a day hospice in conjunction with Hospice Care Ottawa as it is overseen by government affiliated organizations (LHINN).
- 3. Refugee Administration Centre Satellite (perhaps for the diocese)
- 4. Food Community Centre for: Newcomers; the Disadvantaged; Seniors (who are cooking for one) affiliation with Meals on Wheels? A better kitchen would certainly be required.
- 5. Music Hub for Teaching and Performing (new seats would be needed).

Of all these discussion points, the music hub, hospice satellite and community ministries seemed the most possible.
