b) Solar Panels Update: Parish Council decided that for the way forward there should be a committee struck to review the information that is already available and give reports to Corporation and Parish Council. Two people who were suggested were Steve Close and Trevor Dee. It was agreed that we needed someone who had some expertise in this area. It was suggested that we place a request in the bulletin or create an insert letting people know that we were searching for someone to take on this role.

c) Church Temperatures: Georgia Roberts is continuing to research the problem.

d) White Feather: Gillian Morris showed the White Feather, mounted and framed in a shadow box to the members of Parish Council. It has been suggested that it be dedicated during the Indigenous Peoples Week in June.

4. Regular Reports

a) Rector's Report

Rectors Report, January 2020

Induction: The Bishop has chosen March 9, 2020 as the date for Rev. Julian's induction. Parish Council will organize the refreshments for the reception.

Liturgics: In order to have smoother operations around the altar Rev. Julian will be given a refresher for the Altar Guild, servers and Communion assistants on what to do at Communion and funerals. Rev. Julian would also like to have an Aspergillum (A vessel or device used for sprinkling holy water. The ordinary type is a metallic rod with a bulbous tip which absorbs the water and discharges it at the motion of the user's hand.) Altar Guild will be asked to arrange the purchase of one.

Ecumenical Service: Rev. Julian had a meeting with the other clergy to plan the January 19th service and everything is set.

Truth and Reconciliation Workshop: the workshop will take place January 29, 2020. All clergy are expected to attend.

YIP (Youth Internship Program): Donna Rourke the Youth Internship Coordinator would like to spend some time at St. Marks and have a chance to speak to parishioners. The date of May 10, 2020 has been suggested. For information on the program visit <u>https://www.ottawa.anglican.ca/yip/</u>

Vestry: Joy Bowerman has agreed to chair Vestry on February 23, 2020.

b) Warden's Report

Wardens' report plus Property. January 15th 2020

Fr Julian would like to use the pastoral care team which includes friendly visitors, to make visits to people, and also to go with him to share a communion service.

We talked about having something to welcome new people such as a pen, and an immediate sticky name tag, or something other than having them stand up and be embarrassed.

Fr Julian said he would like to make some adjustments to the area around him during communion.

He is going to meet with all who are in any liturgical role during the service, so that they know the whys and hows of what they are doing. That means LACs, Servers, candle bearers and crucifers. He didn't mention readers specifically.

Most of our discussion was acquainting Father Julian of various things until Easter, starting with the pancake supper, and the burning of the palms and then Ash Wednesday with 2 services with the imposition of the ashes.

Lenten observances are something to add not subtract.

Mothering Sunday will be March 22nd with simnel cake and carnations.

For the Holy Week services there will be Maundy Thursday with foot washing, the moving the prepared sacrament and overnight vigil.

Good Friday service will be at 1 p.m. As usual the Choir will be using the hall for practice.

Holy Saturday evening will be the great vigil of Easter and the Easter fire.

The Easter Day service will be as usual.

Vestry meeting will be after the 10 a.m. service on February 23rd in the hall with extra food. P.C. will help to augment the food.

Money is needed for the roof, but we are watching.

On Solar panels there is nothing new to report.

Replacing the floor in church needs considering but would be expensive.

The chairs in the hall are aging and people need to take more care in stacking.

Need to look at possibly look at improving lighting in Hall.

Paul put in a new toilet downstairs because the other one was costing money in waste water, and we are looking for a new sink there also.

Vestry: Vestry will be held on February 23, 2020 in Bishop Reed Hall. Parish Council provide a light lunch.

c) Property Report

Church Floor: The tiles in the church are becoming quite delicate. It is necessary that when pews are being moved that they are lifted rather than dragged.

Hall Chairs: These chairs are starting to wear out. The stacking of them after an event needs to be done carefully. This requires putting the same style on the cart. Those with arms should be stacked last.

Hall Lighting: The bulbs inside the lights could possibly be changed to increase the lumens. The fans could be changed out for those that have lights on the bottom. The red bricks could be painted white to reflect more light. It could be as simple as providing extension cords for renters to plug in lamps near to their work areas.

Toilet Replacement: A new toilet has been installed in one of the downstairs bathrooms.

d) Treasurer's Report

Georgia Roberts presented the budget for 2020.

Due to reduced salaries we are in the black having \$51,310.00 at year's end. It is good to note that if salaries had been maintained we would still have been \$4,222.00 in the black at the end of the year.

User fees are well above what had been budgeted.

There is \$64,790.00 retained earnings left as of the end of the year. Decisions will need to be made regarding these earnings.

Occasional Rentals: At the moment Penny Miler, the rental coordinator is the only person taking care of closing up after a rental event. We really need a roster of people who reside nearby who are also willing to do close-up. We will be presenting a \$20,064.00 deficit budget to Vestry in February.

Pauline Adam offered thanks to Georgia Roberts for her hours of work on the 2020 budget.

Both Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services were quite well attended.

The Book Study continued in December and restarted in January.

The Seniors Coffee, Company and Conversation – continued until just before Christmas, when the group was visited by 'Santa'.
