Rev Jessica would like to see a "visual" for the funds raised. PC asked to think about what could be used other than a thermometer-type visual. One suggestion was a room with components ie chair, table etc with a dollar figure.

4. Regular Reports

a. Rector's Report

5 Marks of Mission Lenten Focus

It has been a busy Lent as we have had guest speakers on Sundays and the Lenten Study on Wednesdays. I've had a wonderful turn out for the 10am Lenten Study on Wednesdays with about 18 people attending. There has been 3 faithful attendees for the 7:30pm evening session.

On Lent 1, February 18th we welcomed Leslie Giddings, who is the Child, Youth and Adult Learning Facilitator of the Diocese of Ottawa. She spoke to the 1st and 2nd Marks of Mission, that are to; Proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom, and To Teach, Baptize and Nurture New Believers.

On Lent 2 we had our Vestry meeting following the Sunday service. I highlighted in my homily that morning that I would love to focus on Welcoming people to St. Mark's over the next year. This would entail researching our options for a new outdoor sign on Fisher Avenue so people know what we offer as well as researching and implementing a new website. Both of these things have been topics of conversation at parish council this past fall and will be able to be paid for by our GIFT campaign funds. It is my hope that we can start moving on both of these ways of advertising St. Mark's in the near future.

On Lent 3, March 4th, we welcomed the Rev. Linda Posthuma who is the Chaplain at Cornerstone. She was able to tell us more about the vital work that Cornerstone does and it helped highlight our Lenten outreach for their new Princeton avenue residence. We have had some response to the Lenten outreach but more reminders are needed to raise our goal of \$3250.

On Lent 4, March 11th we welcomed Larry Langlois who is a member of the All My Relations committee of the Diocese of Ottawa. Larry led a smudging ceremony at 9:40am before the 10am service, outside on the front steps of the church (fisher avenue side). Many people came outside to hear Larry's explanation of the burning of sweetgrass and sage as a cleansing ritual of our indigenous people's. Larry then spoke about the residential schools during his homily and shared the need for continuing reconciliation. He mentioned that the blanket exercise is useful teaching tool for people to learn about the history of how the settlers started to take indigenous land. This would be a good resource for us to invite someone to lead at St. Mark's in the future.

Our last guest speaker will be this upcoming Sunday, March 18th. Randal Goodfellow is the founding Chair of the Diocesan Committee "Creation Matters". He will be addressing the 5th Mark of Mission, "To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth".

The Visioning Day – "Making Our Mark" is booked for Saturday, April 28th with Rev. Monique Stone. She has confirmed that she is able to lead us that day and will become our new neighbour shortly after as she will be the Incumbent of Julian of Norwich in May 2018.

b. Wardens' Report - Cynthia Greer

- A. Two motions were sent by email to members of Parish council, in preparation for the first meeting of the new council on March 14th.
 - Moved by Bruce lodge, and seconded by Pauline Adams, that Janis Perkin be asked to continue as secretary of Parish Council 2018 to February 2019. Motion passed. Unanimous.
 - 2. Moved by Cynthia Greer, seconded by Kathryn Greer-Close, that Bruce Lodge continue as chair of Parish Council 2018 to February 2019, or until Pauline Adams feels ready to take over.

Motion passed. Unanimous

It was suggested that the changeover of Wardens as chair would likely take place in the summer.

B. A question arose at Vestry as to why the salaries of the staff members were not separated out (held over from last year when Father Jim was our priest.)

We referred this question to our Archdeacon, and he suggested that he believed it was better to put them together. In fact no matter how you separate them, the ECOPS amount is not what the incumbent gets paid. It is what we pay for cost of priestly services. His answer is satisfactory to us the wardens.

Thus although I said it would not be discussed at council while I was absent, we don't feel there is need for more discussion.

The second question relating to having a combined sexton/ cleaner/ handy person was discussed, and will be discussed in April.

- C. There was a question in the February minutes relating to the possible uses of CTF funds and rectory funds.
 - Georgia our treasurer will speak to that.
- D. Responsibility for the AED (defibrillator) is in the process of being taken over by the Corporation, once the latest training session has been organized.

 We will be asking someone to take over the monthly check that we have to provide.
- E. From now on a Corporation Meeting will be held at 2 p.m. on the 1st Tuesday of the month
- If you have items you would like us to discuss, please let us know.
- F. We received an email from a group asking if they could rent a piece of our property to put a Donations box on, for a charity. While we didn't discuss it, I couldn't see a suitable place.
- G. If you have experience with this, or want to comment on it on our property, please tell one of the wardens.

#B Combined sexton/cleaner etc: to be discussed at April meeting

#C CTF funds: Georgia explained basics of Trust Fund restrictions of usage in relation to type of donation. Capital expenditure is one restriction but programs of lasting value are OK. Rectory TF general policy is for interest to go towards rector's housing.

#F Donation boxes: to be discussed by Corporation. Noted that areas where boxes are placed often creates a mess.

c. Treasurer's Report - Georgia Roberts

Georgia explained the various reports for the newcomers to Council.

Fundraising line is missing until an actual income received, even though it is a budgeted item. Laurie commented on how very clear and easy the reports are to follow.

d. Property Report - Cynthia Greer

The thermostat in the office has been replaced with a simple one. Thank you Joy.

We looked around to see if everything seemed to be in working order.

It was, until Sunday, when the thermostat in the corner near the sacristy side caused a bit of overheating. This is being investigated.

Your keys should work better in most of the locks, thanks to graphite.

You may see some dirt in the bathroom sinks in the basement. It is probably from the heavy rain and melting which caused the sump pumps to work hard and resulted in water coming up the sink. There doesn't appear to be an outside vent serving the sump pumps and the bathrooms in the basement.

This also causes the sacristy sink to gurgle. Just let water run down it for a short while.

We still have the buckets in the sacristy in case of more drips. This will be dealt with when the weather warms up to tar-spreading temperature.

Asking for helpers resulted in 3 people offering to do little jobs, and 3 more people who gave suggestions of specific people they had employed for single jobs around the house.

We have plans to paint the link and women's bathroom, after the visioning session, after hearing ideas.

If anyone likes looking things up on line, please let me know. I could use your help.

New Ministry Initiative

A meeting of the committee was to have taken place on the 9th but illness prevented this, so the group will be meeting on Thursday the 15th to discuss the two options that were being considered in January. More discussion with Ziba Taj regarding the seniors "drop in" centres and their activities that take place west of our area and how we might fit into the schedule and with what type of services or activities. Ziba is connected with NROCC (Nepean, Rideau, Osgoode Community Centre Association) and coordinates these satellites that provide both services and activities for seniors in their local areas. We have not met with Julian of Norwich due to their state of flux regarding a new priest, but hope to do this as soon as possible as this is another possible seniors partnership.
