# **DRAFT MINUTES**

#### 1. Opening the meeting

#### 2. Approval of the Minutes of the previous meeting September 14, 2016 Minutes Approved: Kate Greer-Close / Fr. Jim Roberts

#### **Clarification:**

- a. **Stewardship Report:** What was the status of articles for the bulletin, newsletter and Advent? Suzanne to contact Michael Perkin for input for the bulletin and newsletter as noted per September minutes.
- b. **Funds for BBQ Cornerstone:** Query to Mothers' Union being contacted for approval. MU is the organizer of the BBQ, as a curtesy their approval for profits to Cornerstone was asked for.

## 3. Business arising from previous meeting(s) Fair Share 2017

Fr. Jim Roberts presented a handout with a simplified explanation of how figures were arrived at for Salaries and Equalisation (ECOPS) / Transportation / Housing and finally Fair Share, comparing the old method and todays method.

- Travel: Diocesan standard proposal for 2017 was \$ 8450 (0.9% increase over 2016)
- ECOPS: Diocesan proposal for 2017 was \$ 79,975 (approx. \$3000 increase over 2016)
- **Housing:** Diocesan proposal for 2017 was \$ 25,889 (Ottawa churches) Fr Jim suggested that his requirements were \$ 22,750 (\$3000 less than we paid in 2016) These details showed the new figures for 2017 will remain basically the same as for 2016. A Motion was required for changes. Motion to be sent to Bill Gilbert.

**MOTION:** Moved by Penny Miller, Seconded by Cynthia Greer:

THAT the housing allowance for The Rev Canon Jim Roberts in 2017 be \$22,750.00. Motion CARRIED

• **Fair Share:** Diocesan proposal for 2017 was \$38,733 but will be reduced by about \$6825 to \$31,808. Actual figures for Insurance is unknown at this time. The Wardens spoke with Archdeacon Chris Dunn and reported that we will attempt to pay our Fair Share in full.

## 4. Regular Reports

- a. Rector: see 3 Fair Share 2017
- b. Wardens / Property Penny Miller presented the report.
  - i. **New Treasurer:** Presently the position is being shared between Gillian Martin and Joy Bowerman. A couple of people have been approached to take on this position. The search is continuing. Names were suggested for possible consideration.

## ii. Property:

- **Dishwasher:** The machine malfunctioned the weekend of a funeral and Pasta supper. It was an electrical issue and was repaired.
- Hall floor: this will be done before Christmas.
- **Dividers:** there is minor damage to a number of dividers that need repairing.
- Parking signs: large signs are to be installed where the cones have recently been used.
- Snow contract: this has been signed with Elio.
- **Outside lights:** the motion activation lights are a problem, Penny to look at options with solar power / sensor lighting. Trust Funds could be used.
- **Pew note holders:** various options have been looked at recently, a plastic sleeve, available at Dollarama for \$1.25, is being tested.

## c. Treasurer: Three Financial Reports attached

The reports were addressed by Penny Miller and Suzanne Wilkins in the absence of the treasurer.

- **Givings:** Our givings have improved over 24% from this time last year.
- **Deficit:** We are still running at a \$9787 deficit.
- **Financial Stewardship:** It was felt that although our givings were up, the momentum started by Advent 2015 and Easter 2016 was being lost, that there seems to be no follow-through and that the momentum will be lost. Suzanne to contact Michael.
- Budget 2017: Input from groups needed ASAP.
- Finance Committee: The committee has not met.
- **Next meeting:** December 14, will be only for the budget, unless there is an urgent topic that needs to be discussed.

## d. Membership / Vitality / Communications:

Margaret Lodge reported as Membership, with Vitality and Communications components.

## i. Membership

We have one new-member family since our newcomers picnic in June.

**Welcoming and Sharing Sunday October 16** Membership and Vitality took part in this special Sunday. As Membership I encouraged people to get active within the parish, and Vitality, with Brian Harrison and Maria Padin, showed what has been done the past year and what will be done in the next few months, to revitalise the spirit of community within the parish. This type of Sunday was a very positive move forward, and maybe one related purely to our own people and our programs – Mission - should be done in the spring. We have to sell ourselves to our own people before we can move forward in the community.

## ii. Vitality

Although the following events were FUND-raisers. Vitality stresses that everything we do is for the Parish and as much as possible FUN-raisers.

- Garage Sale September 17 was a success raising \$1100 thanks to Cynthia Greer and workers.
- **Pasta Supper October 29** Another great parish dinner thanks again to Cynthia Greer, Vitality Group and many workers of every age. Over 100 people attended the lasagna dinner from Mr Bs. The profit was \$1264.
- **Stairwell Carollers December 9** Our next venture will be the Stairwell Corllers, an acapella choir that will perform music for the Advent and Christmas season. Tickets will

be available soon at \$15. John Hancock sold CDs at the bazaar. \$5 from the sale of each comes to the church.

- Our **FUNDraising** efforts prior to today's report was about \$2700, from the Queen's birthday party in April and Tales and Tunes in June. With the Garage Sale and Pasta Supper we have now raised over \$5000 for church funds.
- **Sound System** We need a sound system for BRH. Could we use GIFT funds for this? *Penny noted that she was looking into this item.*

## iii. Communications – Newsletter, Social Media and Advertising

At the October Welcoming Sunday, a few people signed up for electronic mailing of the news-letter and other information and others signed up to distribute the newsletters within their communities. More have added their names since then to the list in the link. I am now in the process of grouping small neighbourhoods for this kind of distribution.

In conjunction with Joy in the office I am looking at various methods of communication and advertising for Vitality events and other groups, eg Bazaar, Art Show, etc, both within the diocese and through local press. eg Facebook is now active with regular changing events.

- h. **Outreach:** Laurie Slaughter provided written report before the meeting
  - Welcoming and Sharing Sunday: Thanks were sent out by e-mail to all who contributed to this day on October 16. Special thanks to Parish Council members who provided a lovely mini-luncheon at the coffee hour. Suzanne and Gillian worked doubly hard both in the kitchen and at the coffee table. Convenors or Chairs of a number of church groups created very informative and attractive displays. Sadly, not many of our churchgoers participated in bringing a guest to church that day. If this day is repeated next fall, hopefully more members will grasp the idea that it is being held primarily so that we may welcome and share with people who do not normally come to our church.
  - Once again, several of us assisted at the second annual Debra Dynes SOUPALICIOUS fundraiser on October 23. It truly is a fun event and a very successful one. It brings in people from not only Carleton Heights but also the whole city, as well as notables such as our Mayor, Gay Cook, Ed Lawrence and Rita Celli from CBC, Dave Smith and Grete Hale. They come for soup and conversation and to support D.D. Family House. Twelve restaurants provided huge urns of delicious soup and St. Mark's volunteers again decorated the tables and even found themselves ladling out soup for some of the restaurants. Our help and support is always appreciated.
  - On November 13, seven St. Mark's people will attend the **Multi Faith Housing Initiative**'s reception at City Hall being held to commemorate National Housing Day. Of the 17 walkers from our church who participated in the Tulipathon Walk last May, five will be among the attendees. The organizers of the event invited us and asked that we bring our vinyl banner as it won first prize from among a number of banners carried in the Walk. It and our church will be acknowledged at the reception for our participation and support.

- i. Rentals:
  - **Dancers:** are no longer renting weekly, but will rent as needed.
  - **Martial Arts**: a new Thursday evening renter in the basement, in the process of setting up his program.
  - Nepean Choir: they opted for Cityview
  - Yoga/Mindfulness: this will be renting on Tuesdays in January
  - Web page: suggestion to offer space for our renters to advertise on the web page to be discussed.

## 5. Other business

a. **Refugees:** Cynthia presented information from Joyce Couvrette. Refugee Ministry Officer with the Diocese of Ottawa. Diocese has received a request from one of the sponsoring groups we work with as a Sponsorship Agreement Holder (SAH), Jewish Family Services of Ottawa (JFS), which is a full service, non-sectarian agency serving residents of the greater Ottawa area with programs and services for all ages, including a program for Syrian children and youth. Work with these young newcomers to Canada has uncovered a desperate need for volunteers to help government-assisted refugee (GAR) families with their integration. Many have spent years in refugee camps and would benefit from support in various aspects of their settlement in Ottawa.

It was agreed to offer this to the parish, with Cynthia Greer and Penny Miller as the contacts.

## b. Notes from Parish Council November 9, 2016

- **Treasurer:** The Wardens are looking for a new Church Treasurer. If you are willing to consider this very important position or even be part of the Treasurer Team, please contact the Wardens, Penny Miller and Sharon Walter.
- **Finances:** The Corporation and Parish Council are grateful for the amazing response of parishioners to increase their givings the last few months. Our overall givings are up \$25,000, nearly 24%, since this time last year! That makes an incredible dent in our deficit budget, but we are still running a deficit. As we approach the Advent season, prayerfully consider a special gift to the work of the church.
- **FUNDraising:** At our Budget Vestry in the Spring, the Vitality Group committed to raising \$5000 through their social events. As of October 31, that goal has already been reached, thanks to the support of you, the parish, and your friends.
- **Refugees:** The Refugee Ministry of the Diocese of Ottawa has received a request from one of the sponsoring groups they work with, that helps residents of the greater Ottawa area with programs and services for all ages, including a program for Syrian children and youth. For these young newcomers to Canada there's a desperate need for volunteers to help government-assisted refugee families with their integration. Many have spent years in refugee camps and would benefit from support in various aspects of their settlement in Ottawa.
