Excerpt from DDFH April 2021.

"Although we are in the middle of another lockdown and stay-at home order, we want to assure you that we are committed to providing essential services to the community and those who need it. The food bank continues to be one of our most needed and accessed services. March was Hunger Count month across Canada. This snapshot in time of food bank activity provides valuable information on the continuing and intense pressure that our lowincome families are facing every day. Our March 2021 food bank count was 2700 people served. Thank you for being a big part of meeting these extraordinary and ongoing needs. We have no indication at this time that this situation will improve. "
