Live streaming our Services

With the approval of Parish Council, a local company has been hired to install live-streaming at St. Mark's. Work is underway and as we get closer to the implementation date, more information will be provided to you.

With the recent provincial and diocesan restrictions, all Ottawa churches are strongly encouraged to record services as much as possible from our own homes. Currently, only 2 people at a given time are recording in the church, mainly Joy Bowerman and Ariane Dind and at other times, Fr. Julian and Joy Bowerman.

When these restrictions are lifted, St. Mark's Eucharistic Sunday Services will be sent over the Internet in real time. Everyone with internet will be able to view the Service as it takes place. We are also looking into phoneins for those people without internet.

The Shape of Parish Ministry Consultation (SPMC)

During the evening of April 20, 2021, Suzanne Bisson, Georgia Roberts, Father Julian and I joined a Diocesan Zoom meeting that launched Bishop Shane Parker's Shape of Parish Ministry Consultation (SPMC). This Diocesan-led project will conclude in October 2022 with a report and recommendations to Bishop Shane at the Diocesan Synod.

There are 4 stages to the consultation:

Stage 1 Ending October of 2021

A draft parish profile will be developed by the SPMC team for each parish, making use of 10 years of the parish's statistical returns data, an approximate age distribution of the parish and an interview with a group of parish leaders about various aspects of the parish.

Stage 2 Ending February 2022

All parish profiles will be made available for analysis by leadership in each parish, assisted by the SPMC team, to determine the fit of a particular parish profile with neighboring parishes.

Stage 3 Ending August 2022

Proposals for (re)shaping parish ministries will be developed through consensus-building discussions with neighbours, and then gathered by the SPMC team.

Stage 4 Ending with Synod in October 2022

A set of integrated proposals will be submitted and formally recommended to Bishop Shane at Synod.

There is much to be done to take our part in the future shape of the Diocese. This is not a voluntary process but a key element of Bishop Shane's vision for the future of the Ottawa Diocese.

Ottawa Horticultural Society Plant Sale

Spring is coming and with it the OHS's second-ever online plant sale! This sale is open to the public and will offer a variety of indoor plants, perennials including native plants, and will feature seedlings of annuals, edibles, and perennials, all donated by OHS members. All items will be "buy now" for immediate sale; no auction items. The sale opens at 10:00 a.m. on May 22nd and closes at 6:00 p.m. on May 25th.

The sale will be run through 32Auctions, the same site as we ran our Fall sale and Auction. Before the sale site opens, you will need to create a username and password for the 32auctions site if you don't already have one. You can do so here:

All plants purchased will be available for pickup on Sat. May 29, 2021 between 12 and 3 pm at **St. Mark's Anglican Church**, 1606 Fisher Ave. at Normandy Cres. in the parking lot behind the church (entrance to parking lot is on Normandy). Please wear a mask and follow social distancing rules. Please bring your item numbers and names of items, boxes or trays to carry your plants, and proof of payment. Payment can be made through Stripe on the auction website. Credit card/debit payments will also be accepted at the time of pick-up, as well as cheques. No cash please – we are trying to be as contactless as possible.

Bishop's Gala

This year the Bishop's Gala will be held on May 27 at 7 pm in the virtual world.
