The Thousand Doves Project

On behalf of the Anglican Diocese of Ottawa's refugee ministry, thank you for your generous support for The Thousand Doves Project! We write to update you on this special initiative and the planning for the installation of the doves at Christ Church Cathedral.

Thanks to our dedicated team of dove-makers across the Diocese (and beyond), some 1,300 paper doves have been created in all shapes, sizes and colours! It was great fun to learn how to make the origami doves, with Zoom workshops and lots of laughter!

And with gratitude to all the project's sponsors, The Thousand Doves Project has also surpassed its fundraising goal! This is a testament to how much people in our Diocese value the life-giving ministry of refugee sponsorship, and the funds will help our ministry be even stronger!

But an important part of The Thousand Doves Project is the inspiration of seeing the doves take flight at the Cathedral. As you know, while we had planned to launch the doves at the Feast of Pentecost this Sunday, at this time of COVID restrictions, there would be no opportunities for viewing the installation. So even though the installation has been planned, we have decided to delay the launch until such time as the peace and hope the doves represent can be appreciated in person.

But don't worry. The doves are comfortably nesting and they will fly to Christ Church Cathedral in the not-too-distant future! We will share more news as it becomes available.

Until the Diocese re-opens our church we are not able to accept in person donations for DDFH. Spring is coming and with it the OHS's second-ever online plant sale! This sale is open to the public and will offer a variety of indoor plants, perennials including native plants, and will feature seedlings of annuals, edibles, and perennials, all donated by OHS members. All items will be "buy now" for immediate sale; no auction items. The sale opens at 10:00 a.m. on May 22nd and closes at 6:00 p.m. on May 25th.

The sale will be run through 32Auctions. Before the sale site opens, you will need to create a username and password for the 32auctions site if you don't already have one. You can do so here:

No cash please – we are trying to be as contactless as possible.
