Good News!

The Diocese is moving to the newly revised Amber Stage of their In This Together plan on July 6. Bishop Shane, in his letter dated June 30 2021 states that "assuming the pandemic continues to abate, all parishes must move forward to offering in-service worship by Sunday, September 12."

We have not been in Amber since December 2020 and the diocesan protocols have been revised since then. Over the next while, St. Mark's pandemic team will be reviewing the revised protocols to ensure a safe reopening and the resumption of many of our church activities.

This pandemic has changed our lives and it has not been easy for any of us. We are looking forward to resuming in-person worship and continuing on with our ministry activities, but we must continue to remain diligent to keep us all safe.

Cash donations, which are tax deductible, are always welcome. Cash enables the House to purchase food in bulk for their food bank. They also welcome gift cards to help purchase food and school supplies.

Once the church reopens, there will be a food donation box (in the Link) that I hope we can fill up on a regular basis. I will deliver to DDFH as often as necessary.

The Wesley Brothers

There is a reference in the sermon this week to the Wesley brothers. John Wesley (born June 28, 1703) was a leader of a revival movement within the Church of England known as Methodism. The societies he founded became the dominant form of the independent Methodist movement that continues to this day. He also wrote hymns that are in our hymn book. The best known to me is *Thee Will I Love, My Strength, My Tower*.

His younger brother Charles was also a leader in the Methodist movement and also wrote hymns. Christ the Lord is Risen Today, Hail the Day that Sees Him Rise, Hark! The Herald Angels Sing, Jesus, Lover of My Soul to name a few. He was also the grandfather of Samuel Sebastian Wesley who composed the hymn tune Aurelia which is the tune for The Church's One Foundation and a number of anthems which the choir sings.
