
Many, many thanks to Alex Dee who is doing the video editing for this endeavour.

News from River Ward

2021 is a new Budget year for the City of Ottawa. A number of local projects will be financed, including, but not limited to the following: (edited for relevance)

- As part of the Trillium Line LRT Phase 2, construction of a new pedestrian/cycling Rideau River Bridge (connecting Vincent Massey Park with Carleton University), Mooney's Bay Station upgrades, construction of new Walkley Station
- Pathway (winter) plowing in Mooney's Bay Park, minor upgrades later in the year to add bike parking and wayfinding signage
- Final Design for the Mooney's Bay Pavilion rebuild, including a permanent washroom at the Canada 150 playground and new vehicle storage facility for park maintenance (reminder, this is the design phase, not construction)
- Dozens of hydro pole replacements along Merivale and Walkley Roads
- Road repaving for Carling (Merivale to Melrose)
- Final Design stage for the Airport Parkway widening

- Carlington Heights Pumping Station Expansion, aka the Carlington Reservoir. Work slated to commence in September.
- Culvert replacements, 1 on Sanford, 2 on Wilshire
- Project design/planning for integrated road, sewer, and water work on Apeldoorn Avenue between Meadowlands Drive East and Falaise Road, as well as Arnhem Street between Normandy Crescent and Greenbriar Avenue (construction expected in 2023)
