## Archdeacon Ralph W. Smith 1927-2021

In 1949, Cadet Ralph Smith (Church Army) was part of the founding ministry of the mission that would became known as St Mark's.

He later became a deacon in 1952 and then priest of the Diocese of Ottawa in 1953, leaving St Mark's to become the rector of Iroquois.

Ralph died on July 19, 2021. He was a faithful and dedicated priest serving his entire 68 ordained years in the Anglican Diocese of Ottawa, and will be dearly missed by his family, friends and the many people he served throughout his priesthood.

Our prayers are of thanks for his ministry, and comfort for his family.

## **Pandemic Restrictions**

We are working to returning to in-person worship. We will be returning to regular Sunday worship September 12. Your parish pandemic team is working on the details as the world continues to change around us.

(This is an updated version from last week. It was revised July 21.) We moved to the Amber Stage on July 6 and will move to Yellow Stage on August 3.

## School Supplies for Debra-Dynes Family House

As promised here is a list of school supplies recommended by OCDSB for the coming school year. I will be in the parking lot every Tuesday in August from 10am until noon to accept your donations. ### Recommended items are:

## Kindergarten to Grade 3

12 pencils, 2 white erasers, 1 package of crayons, 1 package of coloured pencils, 1 package of coloured markers, 1 metric ruler, 1 pair of blunt scissors, 2 glue sticks.

### Grade 4 to Grade 8

12 pencils, 2 white erasers, 1 metric ruler, 1 pair of blunt scissors, 3 ballpoint pens, 1 package of coloured pencils, 2 packages of 3-hole lined refill paper, 6 duotangs, 1 package of coloured markers, 1 calculator, 6 lined notebooks, 1 geometry set, 2 highlighters, 3 binders, binder dividers.
