

She thought to herself that she would like to see the words to *I sing a song of the saints of God.* She turned to 243 and there it was. Thank you, Dad.

#### A Note from the COVID Communiqué

"We are keeping our eyes on infection rates across our diocese, and will alert you if increased restrictions are required this fall. Meanwhile, we encourage you to urge vaccination in your parish and community. At this point, we are not requiring that all worshippers be double-vaccinated. However for certain roles—such as singing in the choir, or administering communion—every eligible person who has no medical condition preventing vaccination should be fully vaccinated before they participate in liturgies (and, in the case of choristers, rehearsals). Clergy are encouraged to announce that they are full vaccinated."

In light of this, I would like to let everyone know that all the people working on the recorded services have been fully vaccinated. This includes clergy, assistants, singer, organist and music mixer.

#### **Pandemic Restrictions**

We are working to returning to in-person worship. We will be returning to regular Sunday worship September 12. Your parish pandemic team is working on the details as the world continues to change around us.

The Diocese has newly revised the pandemic restrictions. If you wish to look at the newly revised restrictions, they may be found in their <u>In This Together</u> plan. (This is an updated version from last week. It was revised July 21.) We moved to the Amber Stage on July 6 and will move to Yellow Stage on August 3.

This pandemic has changed our lives and it has not been easy for any of us. We are looking forward to resuming in-person worship and continuing on with our ministry activities, but we must continue to remain diligent to keep us all safe.

Your continued patience and support are very much appreciated.

Carleton Memorial Daycare is using our church hall for its summer day camp again this summer beginning on Monday, July 5. Because there are stringent COVID-19 protocols in place, they cannot allow anyone into their space while they are using it (including parents of the children).
