Upcoming Changes to Worship

Here are upcoming changes to worship that will come into effect in December with the caveat that we are well used to in these times, unless public health conditions change.

The Status Quo will be maintained until the second Sunday of Advent, December 5.

It is important that we have sufficient time to let parishioners know of the changes and we are urged to approach the loosening of restrictions with great caution.

On December 5, the **10 am Service will require proof of full vaccination**; however, the 8 am Service will remain unchanged, and no proof of vaccination is required;

Once the proof of full vaccination is implemented, physical distancing is still recommended. Masks are mandatory and must be worn by everyone at all times except for communion.

The Diocese strongly urges Parishes to not rush into Option two, which is proof of vaccination and it is recommended that we consider waiting until Advent. Option two ends capacity limits but as much as possible, social distancing should be adhered to.

The pandemic team will continue to register all attendees at service.

- Confirm that you do not have any of the COVID indicators. Questions are on the link door
- Wear a mask
- Sanitize your hands on entry
- Maintain social distancing while in the church and in the pews. (Family groups may sit together); and
- Depart church as quickly as possible after the service.

The Anchor – News from our neighbours at Julian of Norwich

The Anchor is a collaborative neighbourhood created by The Anglican Diocese of Ottawa, Julian of Norwich Anglican Church, and Ottawa-based affordable housing charity Multifaith Housing Initiative. The Anchor's primary guiding objective is to create a collaborative community that maximizes land use for the purpose of social good and quality of life.

The property, located at the corner of Merivale Road and Rossland Avenue, will be comprised of approximately 60 units of affordable housing, a community garden, public greenspace, community gathering space, and space for worship. The project seeks to reimagine and redevelop the existing 2 1/2 acre property on Merivale Road in a way that will...

➤ Be founded on the principles of collaboration, ecological responsibility, interfaith understanding, openness to diversity, and intergenerational engagement

➤ Respond to needs and gaps in our community, including affordable housing and accessible community space

➤ Be done in partnership with other organizations and residents who are committed to the social good

The Anchor will be the sixth affordable housing community of Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI), an Ottawa-based charitable non-profit that provides affordable housing. It is being strengthened by The Anglican Diocese of Ottawa and the parishioners of Julian of Norwich Anglican Church who are leaders in creating inclusive programming and supportive housing that seeks to strengthen individuals and families in the neighbourhoods in which they serve.
