Update on COVID Protocols

There have been significant changes to the protocols since the distancing requirement has been dropped. The right side of the church will maintain distancing for those who feel more comfortable that way. The left side of the church will have the tape removed and distancing is not required. Even though the mask mandate has been removed by the province, the diocese still requires all activities in the church to be masked.

with love on MOTHERING SUNDAY - March 27th, 2022

In the Anglican Church, Mothering Sunday is the 4th Sunday in Lent. Through the years, that Sunday became the one festive day in Lent, including an annual pilgrimage to the Mother Church of the Diocese, the Cathedral. As they processed they sang the ancient psalms of Ascent from the times when Jews processed to the Temple in Jerusalem. As

time went by the Cathedrals were overcrowded, and the festivals were moved to the local Parish churches.

Older children and adults often worked away from home, but on this Sunday they were allowed to go home to their mothers, and families would be reunited. Going home often entailed long walks along paths where they would gather spring flowers. Those in 'service' would also bring fruit and nuts and other food for the family gathering. Flowers and special Simnel cake became part of the celebration.

When Mothers' Union started in England in 1876, Mothering Sunday was revived and encouraged as a family-oriented festival. MU came to Canada in 1888 and Mothering Sunday came with it.

Although Mothering Sunday is not a normal part of the Anglican Church of Canada, many parishes who have a Mothers' Union branch, like St Mark's, still celebrate the 4th Sunday in Lent - Mothering Sunday, which is also when Mothers' Day is celebrated in Britain.

St Mark's present MU branch was started by a group of young mothers in 1983. Its focus is on the family and has continued the tradition of Mothering Sunday by serving Simnel cake, and providing flowers for the children to give to their mothers, and to all the women in the church. (not gathered by the wayside!)

Due to COVID-19, Mothering Sunday was not part of St Mark's in 2020 or 2021 We know that the Simnel cake and flowers were a special part of our coffee hours in the past. So this year, we are offering Simnel cake and a flower, as you leave. Please enjoy a coffee or tea with us before you leave.

A message from Fr Julian

As the palms burned on Shrove Tuesday, a thought came to mind: why not make use of this process of burning, to signify what we would have given up during these 40 days? Hence, on Good Friday 2022, I will invite parishioners to bring a sheet of paper to the liturgy. During the season, please write all the things you would've given up during Lent. It doesn't necessarily have to be a sin. It might be, "sweating the small stuff," indiscipline and anger." During the liturgy those sheets will be destroyed and you may write as many items as you desire. As time progresses, I will share in more detail what will be expected.

In-person Services

- 8 am and 10 am services have resumed.
- The right side of the church will be maintained as distanced seating for those who feel more comfortable that way. The left side of the church will have no distancing requirement.
- Anyone with COVID symptoms should assume that they have the virus and stay home
- Provide proof of double vaccination, if you have not shown it to us before. Booster shots are strongly encouraged.
- Masks must be worn when you enter the building and throughout the service, except when taking communion. Three-layer, medical or N95 masks are encouraged.
- Come warmly dressed since some windows will be open to improve ventilation.

 All leaders in the service, readers, LACs and choir must show proof of triple vaccination.

We anticipate further loosening of our diocesan COVID protocols in the coming weeks. Consult the St Mark's website (www.stmarksottawa.ca) for updates.

PWRDF and Ukraine

PWRDF is supporting Ukrainians forced to flee their homes due to the Russian invasion. The initial grant of \$20,000 issued to an ACT Alliance appeal has been increased to \$50,000. The grants will fund the work of Action by Churches Together (ACT) member Hungarian Interchurch Aid (HIA).
