Prayer Vigil on Maundy Thursday

It has been a tradition at St Mark's, following the Maundy Thursday commemoration of the Last Supper, for members of the congregation to hold an overnight vigil of prayer and meditation. The practice reminds us of Jesus' night of prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane in the hours before his crucifixion.

In pre-COVID times, participants came to the church for the hour of prayer that they signed up for, and the vigil took place in the Peace Chapel, where the elements of bread and wine are placed, following a solemn procession at the close of the Maundy Thursday service. The vigil ran hour by hour from Thursday evening to early on the morning of Good Friday. Last year, due to the pandemic, participants kept the vigil in their own homes instead. We are offering a similar arrangement this year, with the option of coming to the church for those who would prefer to do so.

A sign-up poster is available so those interested can choose the hour for their devotions. We will be asking that they also indicate whether they will stay home or come to church. Diocesan Communique for this week

The practice of sharing the common cup is an ancient and revered part of Christian tradition which, when it was reintroduced into our diocese last August, was a welcome return to normal that brought spiritual strength and comfort to many. However, it did prove to be outside some people's comfort zone during the pandemic and of course receiving bread alone is considered a full communion.

Still, although not every worshipper chooses to drink from the chalice, it is important everyone be offered the opportunity to do so. Those who do not wish to drink from the cup can be encouraged to honour it when it is in front of them. They can do this by crossing their arms across their chest as they listen to the words of administration: 'The blood of Christ, shed for you' or similar words. Saying 'Amen' at that point can be an important statement of faith.

Update on COVID Protocols

There have been significant changes to the protocols since the distancing requirement has been dropped. The right side of the church will maintain distancing for those who feel more comfortable that way. The left side of the church will have the tape removed and distancing is not required. Even though the mask mandate has been removed by the province, **the diocese still requires all activities in the church to be masked**. There is no longer any need to pre-register although proof of double vaccination is still required and proof of triple vaccination for readers, LACs and choir.

A message from Fr Julian

As the palms burned on Shrove Tuesday, a thought came to mind: why not make use of this process of burning, to signify what we would have given up during these 40 days? Hence, on Good Friday 2022, I will invite parishioners to bring a sheet of paper to the liturgy. During the season, please write all the things you would've given up during Lent. It doesn't necessarily have to be a sin. It might be, "sweating the small stuff," indiscipline and anger." During the liturgy those sheets will be destroyed and you may write as many items as you desire. As time progresses, I will share in more detail what will be expected.

In-person Services

- 8 am and 10 am services have resumed.
- The right side of the church will be maintained as distanced seating for those who feel more comfortable that way. The left side of the church will have no distancing requirement.
- Anyone with COVID symptoms should assume that they have the virus and stay home
- Provide proof of double vaccination, if you have not shown it to us before. Booster shots are strongly encouraged.
- Masks must be worn when you enter the building and throughout the service, except when taking communion. Three-layer, medical or N95 masks are encouraged.
- Come warmly dressed since some windows will be open to improve ventilation.
- All leaders in the service, readers, LACs and choir must show proof of triple vaccination.

We anticipate further loosening of our diocesan COVID protocols in the coming weeks. Consult the St Mark's website (www.stmarksottawa.ca) for updates.

PWRDF and Ukraine

PWRDF has allocated \$50,000 to HelpAge Canada to support seniors in Ukraine trying to seek safety in Moldava. Help Age International has been working in Moldova since 2000 and is building up its humanitarian presence there now. The country of 2.6 million has already welcomed 250,000 refugees.
