# Update on COVID Protocols

There have been changes to the protocols since the distancing requirement has been dropped. As of this Sunday, the two middle sections of the church and the left side will be open with no distancing restrictions. The far right pews will still be taped for distancing and comfort. Even though the mask mandate has been removed by the province, the diocese still requires all activities in the church to be masked. There is no longer any need to preregister although proof of double vaccination is still required and proof of triple vaccination for readers, LACs and choir.

Cynthia inquired further because she had boxes of mugs for donation and St Luke's replied that they could always use mugs, even gently used socks, shorts, t-shirts, light jackets, jogging pants, ball caps etc. I would suggest that these could also be brought to the church before the end of April and by one means or another, find themselves at St Luke's Table.

### Food Security and Debra-Dynes

It's no secret that the past few years have been tough on individuals, families, and communities. This is severely impacting our ability to access and purchase food to meet the unprecedented demand. In 2019, we thought serving 1,000 people at our food bank per month was high. Now, serving the 3,000+ people that we see per month seems impossible. While the need is urgent, all extra funding has dried up and donations are predicted to decline. The CandaHelps annual Giving Report found that overall, "there as been a 12% decrease in Canadians donating to charities and that one-in-four are expecting to give less this year". Our residents certainly are not immune to supply chain issues and the rising cost of food. This leaves our community in an incredibly challenging position. With rental costs in Ottawa swelling, there is simply nothing left over after bills have been paid.

The reality is that the need for food is dire in Ottawa. March was Hunger Food Count month across all food banks in Canada. The results will be documented, analyzed, and then made public in the Fall 2022—too late for a response to assist our families. Our perspective has and always will be that food is a human right. No questions asked.

We ask that you consider supporting our food bank in this great time of need. Our current deliveries and donations are just not able to supply the food to those who need it most. We strive to lobby for change and create sustainable solutions, but we do not have the luxury of time. Food security is a bigger issue than any individual can solve, however individual action is required to meet immediate needs of real people and families.

To learn more about food security in our community and city, the Ottawa Coalition of Community Houses interviewed our Executive Director Barbara Carroll for their latest newsletter.

"Essential service delivery belongs in the heart of priority neighbourhoods - where they have been successfully meeting needs for decades. Place-based food banking not only provides sustenance for community members, but also fosters a strong sense of community, built on trusting relationships".

#### A message from Fr Julian

As the palms burned on Shrove Tuesday, a thought came to mind: why not make use of this process of burning, to signify what we would have given up during these 40 days? Hence, on Good Friday 2022, I will invite parishioners to bring a sheet of paper to the liturgy. During the season, please write all the things you would've given up during Lent. It doesn't necessarily have to be a sin. It might be, "sweating the small stuff," indiscipline and anger." During the liturgy those sheets will be destroyed and you may write as many items as you desire. As time progresses, I will share in more detail what will be expected.

#### **In-person Services**

- 8 am and 10 am services have resumed.
- The far right side of the church will be maintained as distanced seating for those who feel more comfortable that way. The

left side and middle of the church will have no distancing requirement.

- Anyone with COVID symptoms should assume that they have the virus and stay home
- Provide proof of double vaccination, if you have not shown it to us before. Booster shots are strongly encouraged.
- Masks must be worn when you enter the building and throughout the service, except when taking communion. Three-layer, medical or N95 masks are encouraged.
- Come warmly dressed since some windows will be open to improve ventilation.
- All leaders in the service, readers, LACs and choir must show proof of triple vaccination. We anticipate further loosening of our diocesan COVID protocols in the coming weeks. Consult the St Mark's website (www.stmarksottawa.ca) for updates.

#### **PWRDF** and Ukraine

PWRDF has allocated \$50,000 to HelpAge Canada to support seniors in Ukraine trying to seek safety in Moldava. Help Age International has been working in Moldova since 2000 and is building up its humanitarian presence there now. The country of 2.6 million has already welcomed 250,000 refugees.
