Of Internet and Recorded Streams

As of Thursday (June 2), there was still no internet at the church. Steve Close kindly did an in-depth investigation and it looks like the cable leading into the church is disconnected. A technician is coming Friday afternoon to restore service.

The intention last week was to record the stream and upload when internet became available. This would have been a great solution. Unfortunately, it ran into several snags. The SSD (Solid State Drive) which records the streams has a USB C connector. This is newer and only newer computers tend to have one. The first household I looked in on Sunday, which had power, did not have a computer with a USB C. When I got power and internet back at home, I plugged it into my computer but it turns out the SSD was formatted only for MAC computers. Alright. I waited until Alex was available and he put the SSD in his new computer and it turns out

that it was full and stopped recording during Lent. So unfortunately, I will not be able to upload last week's service. I am now wiser and have formulated a plan so that if we meet this situation again, recording a service will work. Another learning experience!

Changes to COVID restrictions

The diocese entered into the Green stage of the Pandemic plan on June 1. In its communiqué, it states "It's increasingly clear the pandemic is not going away any time soon and entering the Green stage, rather than just saying "we're back to normal", is an important symbol that we are still operating under the pandemic plan—and an acknowledgment that restrictions could increase again if the virus resurges (as it has the two previous falls, after more open summers)."

At St Mark's, we will stay in modified yellow (status quo) during the month of June with some gradual changes throughout the month.

- Masks are still required until further notice.
- No Proof of Vaccine required to enter the church as of June 5
- The table at the front of the nave will be removed June 12 and Communion will be administered at the rail. Distance must be maintained.
- The Peace is status quo until further notice.
- ¼ of the nave will remain with "distancing tape" until further notice.

Support for Ukrainian Refugees

On Tuesday, May 31, Pauline Adams, Joan Grayer and I delivered juices and homemade assorted loaves to the Campus Ministry at Algonquin College.

The campus minister let me know that only St. Mark's (every Tuesday) and the Salvation Army (every second Tuesday) are providing contributions on a regular basis. Leftover snacks are kept for the Thursday classes.

There are now 100 Ukrainians enrolled in the English classes.

What is needed for the future:

1. Baked goods, juices, coffee, milk. Please plate your baked goods. Anything else you wish to contribute such as cheese, crackers are welcome. A roster of bakers is placed on the bulletin board in the link. Please add or delete your name as your priorities may have changed. Goods can be delivered to the

church on Sunday or brought to the church Tuesday morning between 11:45 AM and 12:15 PM.

2. English as a second language (ESL) instructors. Joan and Pauline led small groups of Ukrainians in English conversations. Both said this worked quite well as the students in their groups had some (various degrees of proficiency) knowledge of English. There were other classes where the students were beginners. The age group is from 18 years to 50 years. Pauline, a former ESL instructor said the experience was very enjoyable and she plans to instruct at further sessions.

You don't have to be ESL certified to instruct but willing to carry on conversations with Ukrainians learning English and be innovative in developing topics to discuss.

Please let me know if you would like to help out in providing ESL instruction. Classes are held Tuesday and Thursday from 1:00 PM to 2:00 PM. There is a more relaxed conversation/coffee break from 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm.
