A New Banner for National Indigenous Day of Prayer

Indigenous Day of Prayer with a panel she had purchased. An image of the panel appears on the front of the bulletin this week and is shown on the previous page

The panel is called 'Every Child Matters' designed by Karen Erickson and is part of a single colour way by Northcott fabrics called The Journey Home.

Here is the description of the panel:

"In light of the recent traumatic events that have unfolded at former Residential Schools across Canada, Karen Erickson created 'Every Child Matters' out of reverence to those grieving. This painting depicts two siblings who were finally set free after being grimly discovered at a Residential School.

The children who are shown holding hands were torn apart from each other, but now reunited as they make their way back home. Karen included beautiful imagery such as a moon and feathers to represent the First Nations, Inuit and Metis people joining together to guide the two siblings home.

100% of the net proceeds from the sales of the panel from 'The Journey Home' will be donated to the Indian Residential School Survivors Society and the Orange Shirt Society."

Who on earth was Melchizedek?

Melchizedek was both a priest and king. He brought bread and wine to Abram after Abram went to rescue his nephew Lot. He's seen as the greatest example of the priesthood. He's also seen as foreshadowing the divine priesthood of Christ. Finally, we continue the Melchizedek order because we continue to use bread and wine within the cultus (church)

Changes to COVID restrictions

The diocese entered into the Green stage of the Pandemic plan on June 1. In its communiqué, it states “It’s increasingly clear the pandemic is not going away any time soon and entering the Green stage, rather than just saying “we’re back to normal”, is an important symbol that we are still operating under the pandemic plan—and an acknowledgment that restrictions could increase again if the virus resurges (as it has the two previous falls, after more open summers).”

At St Mark’s, we will stay in modified yellow (status quo) during the month of June with some gradual changes throughout the month.

- Masks are still required until further notice.
- No Proof of Vaccine required to enter the church as of June 5
- The table at the front of the nave will be removed June 12 and Communion will be administered at the rail. Distance must be maintained.
- The Peace is status quo until further notice.
- ¼ of the nave will remain with “distancing tape” until further notice.

Walk-in Vaccine Clinic

There are walk-in vaccine clinics operating at the Emerald Plaza library and the multi-purpose room at 1341 Meadowlands for the next while. They are not that busy so if you are looking for another dose, it is a great way
