Welcome to our weekly newsletter. We are continuing the weekly newsletter for the foreseeable future.


Shout Outs


- Alan Reed celebrated his birthday on Sunday January 22nd

A past president of the STLHE, she was also the inaugural chair of the Educational Developers Caucus and Canada's representative on the Council of the International Consortium for Educational Development. She currently chairs the STLHE Task Force on Equity, Diversity and Inclusion. A frequently sought keynote speaker, Dr Mighty has received awards for excellence in teaching, research, professional service and leadership, and is the 2020 recipient of the Christopher Knapper Lifetime Achievement Award.
