#### **Preparing for Emergencies**

A subgroup of the Parkwood Hills Community Stakeholders Committee has been meeting over the past few months to prepare for emergencies. They have been working to develop strategies including social connections and networks, in addition to general preparedness efforts. As part of this work, they have written a series of three articles which we have been asked to share. The first of the articles appears below.

# Prepare for emergencies by getting to know your neighbours!

During an emergency, family, friends, and neighbors may be the first people able to help each other.

Getting to know those who live close to you is not only a wonderful way to build friendships, it also reduces loneliness and creates a safety net.

When emergencies happen, some services may not be available, or they may be difficult to access. As well, it can take a few days for additional help to arrive. Helping each other can reduce stress and help keep you safe.

Do you know anyone who may need support?

- Are there isolated seniors in your neighborhood?
- Do those who live close by have young children or pets?
- Would one of your neighbors need assistance due to special needs? What can you do?

#### **Summer Camps**

Our church building continues to be used over the summer by a number of different groups. As we did last summer, we have 2 day camps operating every day for most of the summer. The Carleton Memorial Daycare operates a day camp for school age children in Bishop Reed Hall and Pedalheads operates a bicycle camp in the back parking lot, using the lower hall for their inside space. The grounds are certainly lively!

## **Used Postage Stamps**

A large amount of used postage stamps was dropped off to OXFAM Canada on MacArthur Avenue.

Over the years, St. Mark's Church has collected used postage stamps, which we have sent to Effect Hope, an organization that helps those affected by leprosy and other tropical diseases. Doreen Matweow who took this on for a number of years is no longer able to process the stamps. We were unable to find someone in the church to continue this worthwhile ministry. We decided to send our stamps to Oxfam Canada. Used postage stamps can still be donated to St. Mark's.

Oxfam Canada has been raising funds for projects across the globe from its stamp program. The Oxfam Canada stamp volunteers raise roughly \$30,000 annually by sorting and selling stamps to collectors.

#### **Stairwell Carollers Auditions**

Stairwell Carollers was founded in 1977 by our director Pierre Massie, who was a music University of Ottawa music student at the time. Our mandate is to raise funds for charities and student scholarships. Since 1986 we've donated over \$144,000 to these causes.

This fall marks our 46th year singing in the National Capital Region and we will again be recruiting singers this August 2023. We are in dire need of sopranos, altos, tenors and basses in order to continue moving forward with our philanthropic endeavors. #### **COVID** Update

In his most recent communique, our Bishop announced a revision of the Diocesan COVID restrictions. Parishes can now observe normal social and liturgical practices, with one exception, while following the three main public health recommendations. These are:

- asking people to stay home when sick;
- encouraging mask-wearing in indoor spaces; and

The one liturgical exception to normal practices is that LAC's must wear masks when administering communion.
