With summer's sun slowly falling, and the cold temperatures making their way into the weather reports, Belong Ottawa is preparing for this chilly season by stocking up on much needed toiletry and winter items! All donations can be brought in to St Mark's and they will be taken to Belong Ottawa.

Financial Update

Although our collections income is actually slightly higher than last year, we are still almost \$10,000 behind where we hoped to be at the end of August. Other revenues have increased, particularly our rentals income so that we are only about \$3,000 dollars under our expected net income. The bank balance is as low as it has been since 2010.

COVID Status

In his most recent communique, our Bishop announced a revision of the Diocesan

COVID restrictions. Parishes can now observe normal social and liturgical practices, with one exception, while following the three main public health recommendations. These are:

- asking people to stay home when sick;
- encouraging mask-wearing in indoor spaces; and
- keeping up-to-date on COVID boosters.

The one liturgical exception to normal practices is that LAC's must wear masks when administering communion.
