Remembrance Sunday




Church Calendars

Coffee, Company & Conversation



On Thursday at Coffee, Company and Conversation, 31 people were present to hear an inspiring talk by the author Barry Finlay. The word "inspiration" was the key to his presentation. He outlined how, after retirement from the financial policy world, he challenged himself to first, climb Mount Kilimanjaro with his son, then to write a book about it and its inspiration for him. From non fiction, he then moved on to writing two mystery series, a total of seven books, and explained the inspiration for each of the novels. His latest, a non fiction book entitled "Just Keep Climbing", tells of eight inspired and exceptional individuals who shared their stories of challenge and of reaching a goal. At the risk of overusing the word "inspiration", Barry's descriptions of these life experiences truly was inspiring, and had people asking questions for some time after his talk. We were privileged to have this Queen Elizabeth Diamond Jubilee Medal award recipient (for his philanthropy) with us for the morning.

Synod Highlights - The Action Plan has Six Components:

- 1. A Time of Prayer Listening for Divine Sparks in our Midst A diocesan-wide initiative, A Time of Prayer, was launched on the final morning of Synod. It calls on all parishes, groups, and individuals to participate in regular prayer to discern where God wants us to act. The Bishop will appoint a working group to pray for, oversee, and implement "A Time of Prayer." Each parish and group will identify a point person. Prompts, resources, and prayers will be generated.
- 2. Establishing and overseeing the practice of Contextual Mission the Bishop, Diocesan Council and other lay and clergy leaders will play an essential role in the support, monitoring, evaluation, and communications.
- 3. Supporting Leaders, Lay and Clergy with resources such as a knowledge network, qualified coaches, symposia, opportunities to participate in courses and workshops.
- 4. Supporting Parishes and Congregations with a step-by-step guide to engaging in contextual mission and new worshipping communities; multiple sources of funding and other resources.
- 5. **Financial Resources** Parish funds used to support new contextual mission initiatives and NWCs will be exempt from assessment for Proportional Parish Share and a microgrant program will be established to support contextual mission and NWCs and will be financed from the Future Fund.

COVID Status

In his most recent communique, our Bishop announced a revision of the Diocesan COVID restrictions. Parishes can now observe normal social and liturgical practices, with one exception, while following the three main public health recommendations. These are:

- asking people to stay home when sick;
- encouraging mask-wearing in indoor spaces; and
- keeping up-to-date on COVID boosters.

The one liturgical exception to normal practices is that LAC's must wear masks when administering communion.
