

Celebrating BHM with a Movie: Black Panther

Black Panther is a 2018 film based on the Marvel Comics character of the same name. The first Marvel Studios film with a Black director (Ryan Coogler) and a predominantly Black cast, Black Panther stars the late Chadwick Boseman, alongside other notable Black stars including Michael B. Jordan, Angela Bassett, Forest Whitaker, Sterling K. Brown, Lupita Nyong'o, Danai Gurira, Daniel Kaluuya, and Letitia Wright.

When it was released in 2018, **Black Panther** became a cultural phenomenon with Blacks the world over attending movie theatres in droves, proudly dressed in outfits symbolizing Black communities and culture. Named one of the top 10 films of 2018, **Black Panther** grossed \$1.3 Billion worldwide and broke numerous box-office records. It became the highest-grossing film directed by a Black filmmaker. It was nominated for seven Academy Awards, winning three, and received numerous accolades for its direction, writing, acting, costume design, production values, and soundtrack.

In honour of Black History Month 2024, everyone is invited to join us for a free viewing of **Black Panther** on Saturday, February 17 at 2:00 pm at St Thomas the Apostle Anglican Church, located at 2345 Alta Vista Drive, Ottawa. This event is co-hosted by St Thomas and St Mark's.

COVID Status

In his most recent communique, our Bishop announced a revision of the Diocesan COVID restrictions. Parishes can now observe normal social and liturgical practices, with one exception, while following the three main public health recommendations. These are:

- asking people to stay home when sick;
- encouraging mask-wearing in indoor spaces; and
- keeping up-to-date on COVID boosters.

The one liturgical exception to normal practices is that LAC's must wear masks when administering communion.
