


Good Will Offering - Black History Month


#### **Guest Speaker February 11**

#### BHM Movie: Black Panther February 17 2pm at St Thomas'

**Black Panther** is a 2018 film based on the Marvel Comics character of the same name. The first Marvel Studios film with a Black director (Ryan Coogler) and a predominantly Black cast.

When it was released in 2018, **Black Panther** became a cultural phenomenon with Blacks the world over attending movie theatres in droves, proudly dressed in outfits symbolizing Black communities and culture. It became the highest-grossing film directed by a Black filmmaker. It was nominated for seven Academy Awards, winning three, and received numerous accolades for its direction, writing, acting, costume design, production values, and soundtrack.

In honour of Black History Month 2024, everyone is invited to join us for a free viewing of **Black Panther** on Saturday, February 17 at 2:00 pm at St Thomas the Apostle Anglican Church, located at 2345 Alta Vista Drive, Ottawa. This event is co-hosted by St Thomas' and St Mark's.

#### **PWRDF 2024 Lenten Resource**

Daily reflections begin February 14!

Health and well-being – without one, the other simply isn't possible. Likewise, the wellbeing of humans isn't possible without a healthy planet; something we are discovering every day as we face a growing and global climate crisis.

This theme is at the centre of PWRDF's 2024 Lent Resource.

Throughout the Lenten season, you will receive a daily email with a reflection from Dr. Sylvia Keesmaat, on what health, well-being and good living require of us in our lives and our relationships with one another, with creation and with God.

As you will read, things begin to break down when human beings separate themselves from creation, exploiting it as a commodity, or separate from and exploit one another. In so doing, we separate ourselves from the Creator.

And so, on this journey through Lent, PWRDF invites you to join Dr. Keesmaat as she walks with us, meditating on our current climate crisis and the well-being of ALL of creation, human and non-human, and offering us lessons in repair and restoration that are both profoundly ancient and current.

#### **COVID** Status

In his most recent communique, our Bishop announced a revision of the Diocesan COVID restrictions. Parishes can now observe normal social and liturgical practices, with one exception, while following the three main public health recommendations. These are:

- asking people to stay home when sick;
- encouraging mask-wearing in indoor spaces; and
- keeping up-to-date on COVID boosters.

The one liturgical exception to normal practices is that LAC's must wear masks when administering communion.
