# Herbert O'Driscoll 17 October 1928 – 25 July 2024

### A Personal Recollection

When I was 24, still living at home, in a relationship with my now husband, I made the momentous decision to do graduate work at UBC at the Institute of Animal Resource Ecology. My dad had two cousins who lived in Vancouver, not a great distance from the University. When I arrived in Vancouver, I had a basement apartment in a house, courtesy of a co-worker of Dad's cousin, Thelma. I often had dinner with Thelma and her sister, Lynn, and when I trying to find my feet, looking for a place to sing, Thelma suggested I try Christ Church Cathedral as it had a good reputation. I went to church the next Sunday, enjoyed the service and spoke to the Patrick Wedd, the choir director, saying

that I would like to sing in the choir. I was clueless. It was an auditioned choir so I went along on Thursday evening, sang an audition, was given a set of books and gown and told I could start on Sunday. It all seemed quite normal to me. It was not until someone else was interested in joining the choir, went to Thursday practices for over a month and never did get a gown to sing on Sunday morning that I realized how lucky I was.

During my first year there, Herbert O'Driscoll was the dean of the cathedral. As well as singing amazing music, I was listening to amazing sermons. Herb had a mesmerizing speaking voice. He was a delight to listen to – even if it was the most mundane thing he was saying. I can remember talking to him at a choir party while he was reflecting on the previous Sunday's service. There had been nothing unusual in the service from my point of view, no pauses or hesitations. When he was telling the story, he recalled that he had flipped the page in the missal and realized that there was supposed to be a collect which he had neglected to find. His interior voice gasped a little bit, but his exterior voice continued smoothly and spoke an appropriate collect – which he made up on the spot.

We were always singing new hymns. Herbie wrote the words to many hymns. Common Praise has seven hymns which were written by him. You might recognize *The Love of Jesus Calls Us* and *Come and Journey with a Saviour*, which we sing quite often. I have an interim hymn book from the Diocese of New Westminster from 1982 with 10 hymns with texts written by Herbert O'Driscoll. Similarly, there are 12 hymns written by Patrick Wedd, five of which are tunes for texts by Herb. Patrick has 18 pieces listed on Common Praise.

They are both gone now. Patrick died in 2019 and Herb on July 25 of this year. Their memory will live on in the music of our liturgy.

St John the Evangelist on Elgin Street has released a memorial <u>YouTube video</u> with a 2021 interview with Herbert O'Driscoll on the Trinity.

## **Biography**

Thomas Herbert O'Driscoll was born in Ireland and immigrated to Canada to become one of the most highly regarded preachers in the Anglican Church. A consummate storyteller, a popular broadcast and print commentator, and prolific hymn writer, he authored numerous books on Bible interpretation and the spiritual life, many of which reflect Celtic Christianity.

O'Driscoll retired in 1993 and published sixteen books, in addition to contributing regular columns for church publications, leading pilgrimages, and preaching. "The Rev. Canon Dr. Herbert O'Driscoll is many things: former parish priest and cathedral dean, internationally renowned conference and pilgrimage leader, hymnodist and storyteller, author of over fifty books. Perhaps above all, he is a great preacher and teacher of preaching. When invited recently to give an Easter Day sermon on Zoom (at age 92) Herb accepted at once. "After all," he explained, "I'm hard-wired for preaching." (From 2022, O'Driscoll Forum, Vancouver School of Theology.

# Is it time to update your COVID vaccine?

Ottawa Public Health is holding a spring vaccination campaign. It includes the recommendation that people over 65 who have not received a COVID-19 vaccine in the past 6 months should do so now. A typical early-summer spike in cases is expected and research has shown that COVID-19 can still cause serious illness among older adults — even more severe than seasonal influenza. If you are eligible for a COVID shot, vaccines are available at pharmacies and at some neighbourhood health and wellness hubs. More information is available at ottawapublichealth.ca
