

Fr Julian's Departure

As was announced last Sunday, Fr Julian's last day at St. Mark's will be January 12, 2025. Fr. Julian leaves to be the Rector of Good Shepherd Episcopal Church in Wichita, Kansas. As well, the Bishop of Kansas has appointment him as the Co-Chair of the task force on Social Justice for the entire Episcopal Diocese of Kansas.

It has been a long-standing tradition at St. Mark's of offering a monetary gift, a "priest's purse" to a priest who is leaving. In this way, we offer appreciation, gratitude and the recognition of the contributions Fr. Jullian has made to St Mark's over the last five years as our Rector. An envelope is placed at the back of the church for donations or you can put your donation (cash or cheque) in an envelope with his name on it and place in the collection plate. This is entirely voluntary and note that contributions are not tax deductible.

We will say our farewells to Fr. Julian after service on January 12 and more will follow on this as we get closer to the date. While we wish Fr. Julian the best in his new endeavours, he will be sorely missed by the parish and the many friends he has made in Ottawa.

Latest Update on COVID 19

From now until October 28th, doses of the new COVID-19 vaccine are prioritized for high-risk and priority populations, which include adults 65 years of age and older. Starting October 28th, anyone 6 months and older can access the COVID-19 vaccine in Ontario.
