Janis and Michael Perkin shared their amazing adventure to Antarctica by cruise ship beginning in Sao Paolo Brazil, then down the coast of South America stopping at Montevideo Uruguay, Buenos Aires, Argentina, and a number of other South American sites, the Falkland Islands, and down to Tierra del Fuego, the southernmost point of the continent. From there they were taken to the edge of Antarctica to view the penguins of which there were many, and the terrain of the icy and isolated continent. It was an experience that only .0001 percent of the world's population has experienced. There is rigid international determination to protect this very ecologically delicate environment.



Michael's comprehensive slides of the journey were enhanced by Janis' verbal description of each place. It was fascinating for the over 55 people present. The number of questions that followed indicated the great interest in this adventure. Many thanks to Janis and Michael for the detailed work that they put into their presentation.
