Tulipathon Walk for the Multifaith Housing Initiative



The annual Tulipathon Walk organized by The Multifaith Housing Initiative, is being held during the afternoon on Sunday, May 25. It starts

and finishes at Commissioners Park across from Dows Lake. People from many faith groups will be walking in support of the important mission to provide safe and affordable housing for low-income families, veterans, and others in need of a home in a supportive community.

Coffee, Company & Conversation

It was a very interesting morning at CCC on Thursday as the theme was Asian Heritage Month. Held in May, the month's theme this year is "Unity in Diversity". South Asians are the fastest growing ethnic group in Canada, and make up 26% of the total.

Two people of Asian heritage spoke about their background and the experience of living in Canada and maintaining their culture.



Nubuo Obukuro, of Japanese descent, shared the story of his parents' settling in Canada where he was born, and of their internment during the Second World War. It was a personal example of a sad time in history. He discussed the later actions of the government to acknowledge this, and showed his copy of an Acknowledgment signed by Prime Minister Mulroney which was given to Japanese Canadians who had been affected by this chapter in the Canadian story He also talked briefly about East Asia and the relationship among the countries of the Asian Pacific region. Many East Asians have become part of Canada's population and mosaic.



Suja Mani, from India originally, spoke beautifully about the great diversity of peoples and religions in India. After marrying, Suja first lived in the Middle East and then emigrated from there to Canada. Her personal experiences and observations of the differences between South Asian people and Canadians in interactions and customs, was quite interesting. She wore a beautiful traditional Indian outfit which added to her presentation.

These shared experiences and stories gave real meaning to Asian Heritage Month in Canada.

The morning's theme was enhanced with vases of apple blossoms, and fan shaped flower napkins.



The food simply was amazing in its adherence to the theme! The bakers of the day, Suzanne



and Pat, outdid themselves. The fruit was mini bananas from Thailand, pineapple, clementines, and grapes, as well as spring rolls, sweet rice crackers, vegetable and

crab sushi, samosas, Matcha green tea muffins, Chinese almond cookies, Fortune cookies, sugar cookies and seaweed snacks, along with blue and cheddar cheeses. The snacks of the day were very much an Asian feast. Many thanks to our bakers.

Next week is a very special one with a beloved and well known local mystery writer coming to speak. Mary Jane Maffini, a member of the Ottawa Women's Crime Writers' Group and former co-owner of Prime Crime Bookshop, will be speaking on the three mystery series that she's written over the years, all of whom take place in our city or region.
