The annual Tulipathon Walk organized by The Multifaith Housing Initiative, is being held during the afternoon on Sunday, May 25. It starts and finishes at Commissioners Park across from Dows Lake. People from many faith groups will be walking in support of the important mission to provide safe and affordable housing for low-income families, veterans, and others in need of a home in a supportive community.

"Murder and mayhem" were the order of the morning at CCC on Thursday. The guest was local crime fiction author, Mary Jane Maffini, who delighted the group with her tips on writing a murder mystery. Mary Jane had the group create a fictional character for a crime story complete with personality quirks and a murder to solve. It was a fun exercise. She talked about her very popular three mystery series that she's written over the years. One of the appealing features of the three series is that they are situated in Ottawa or nearby. Her female sleuths are characters that one can't forget. In addition, she has written over two dozen short stories and won a number of Canadian awards for her crime stories. She also writes a series with her daughter under the name Victoria Abbott.

As she describes herself, she is a "lapsed librarian" and a former co-owner of Prime Crime Mystery Bookstore in Ottawa for a number of years. She is a charter member of the group, " The Ladies' Killing Circle", a group of well known female crime writers in the Ottawa area. She was a pleasure to listen to as she has a wonderful sense of humour about crime and murder in the abstract. Over 45 people were present to hear her talk, and a number were eager to buy her signed books.

Parish Council Highlights

Financial Update

Overall, we are well ahead (~\$11,000) of where we expected to be at this time of year.

Our User Fees are more than expected and the bazaar did slightly better than expected. Our Lenten Outreach was the highest it has been in several years and it has been forwarded to the diocese for distribution.

Our overall expenses are much lower than expected due to having an interim priest.

The area of concern is the collections income. Out total collections income to the end of April is the lowest it has been. While it is not a problem this year, it does affect long-term sustainability. The stewardship committee being assembled needs to look seriously at how to address this issue.

We are now proceeding with the costly repairs through a licensed HVAC specialist. In the meantime, the system remains off, and we appreciate your patience.

We give heartfelt thanks for the many hands and hearts that make St. Mark's the vibrant and caring community it is. To our dedicated volunteers—thank you for your generous service. To Father David Clunie, we are deeply grateful for your wise leadership and constant encouragement. We also thank the Church Wardens, who selflessly offer their time and energy to keep our church running smoothly, and the Parish Council, whose longstanding commitment to St. Mark's is a true blessing. Our sincere appreciation goes to the choir and music directors, whose gifts bring us joy and inspiration each Sunday, and to our devoted staff—especially Joy and Rose—for their tireless and faithful work behind the scenes.

Finally, we extend our deepest gratitude to all who support St. Mark's through prayer, presence, and financial contributions.
