On Sunday, August 2 we raised the third of the flags on our new flagpole. As with the others these flags are meant to celebrate or mark important moments within our wider community. We began with the 'Survivors Flag' in June to mark those who had been impacted by residential schools. In July we raised to the Canadian flag to celebrate our country's birthday

Our new flag is the 'Pride Flag' sometimes known as the 'Rainbow Flag'. August is Capital Pride, the month in which the City of Ottawa celebrates Pride. A time to remember the struggles and celebrate the successes of our 2SLGBTQ+ siblings. Flying a Pride Flag aligns us with other businesses, schools, and churches within the City of Ottawa and across our Diocese who also fly Pride flags. More importantly it signals to our wider community that St Mark's is a welcoming, affirming place.
